Uniform Policy

Introduction

At Preston Primary School we are proud of our appearance and our school uniform. We feel it promotes a positive attitude towards learning in school and therefore we strongly encourage everyone to wear their uniform with pride. We believe school uniform is an important part in raising children's pride in their school.

- We believe it will prepare them for secondary school life.
- We believe it lessens arguments at home
- We believe it stops discrimination
- We believe it enables children to be part of the whole school community.

Our school council have made a major contribution to this policy by collecting the views of each class and sharing them during School Council Meetings.

School Uniform

All children are required to wear the uniform to school at all times. All pupils must wear uniform when representing the school at offsite events unless informed otherwise.

Please ensure that all items of uniform are clearly labelled with your child's name.

Our School uniform is:-

- Grey School trousers or skirt/pinafore dress
- White shirt/blouse
- Preston School Tie
- V necked burgundy jumper/cardigan with school logo
- Black shoes
- Grey socks/tights
- Burgundy gingham dress for the summer term

PE Kit:-

- Plain white t-shirt or polo shirt
- Navy blue shorts or skirt
- Plimsolls for hall use.
- Trainers for outside use
- A PE bag

The school does not permit:

- Jewellery except for studs. These must be removed or taped for P.E.
- Make-up including nail varnish/ polish
- Tattoos (including the transfer type)
- High or narrow heeled shoes
- Unconventional or dramatic hairstyles: added hair colours must be natural and subtle. Close shaved heads and patterns cut into hair or eyebrows are not acceptable. Very short hairstyles or extreme hairstyles (e.g. where some hair is very short and the rest is not) are not acceptable
- Skirts and dresses that are significantly above the knee
- Tops that expose the midriff
- Hoodies/sweatshirts replacing school jumpers or coats

Students who have shoulder length hair, or longer, may be required to tie it back for health and safety reasons and/or if it obscures the face.

Preston Primary School reserves the right to ask children to change clothing, remove make-up or have a hair style change should this policy be contravened. All decisions about appropriate uniform and appearance rest initially with the Head of School, with the full support of the Academy Council and the Executive Head.
