Expand the school values conversation to include tracking and rewards that strengthen pupils as independent, robust learners.

Early Years Provision

Further develop a Maths Mastery approach in conjunction with regional Maths Hub.

Use curriculum autonomy to bring more aspects of risky play into the everyday provision.

Continuous Provision extended from Foundation Stage into Year 1.
